- Friday, February 3 is a non attendance day for students and ½ principal directed and ½ teacher directed day

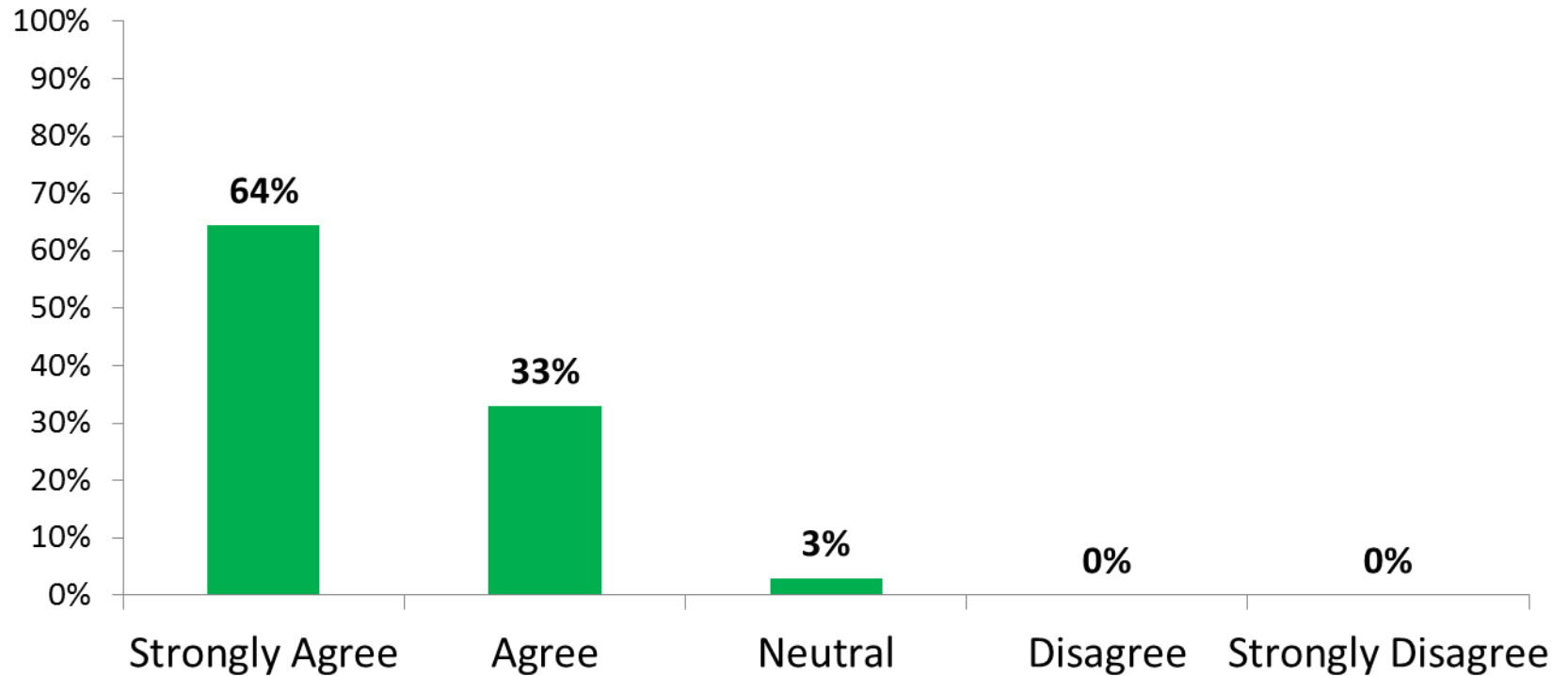
Community

- Kellogg Karols was December 20 and was very well attended

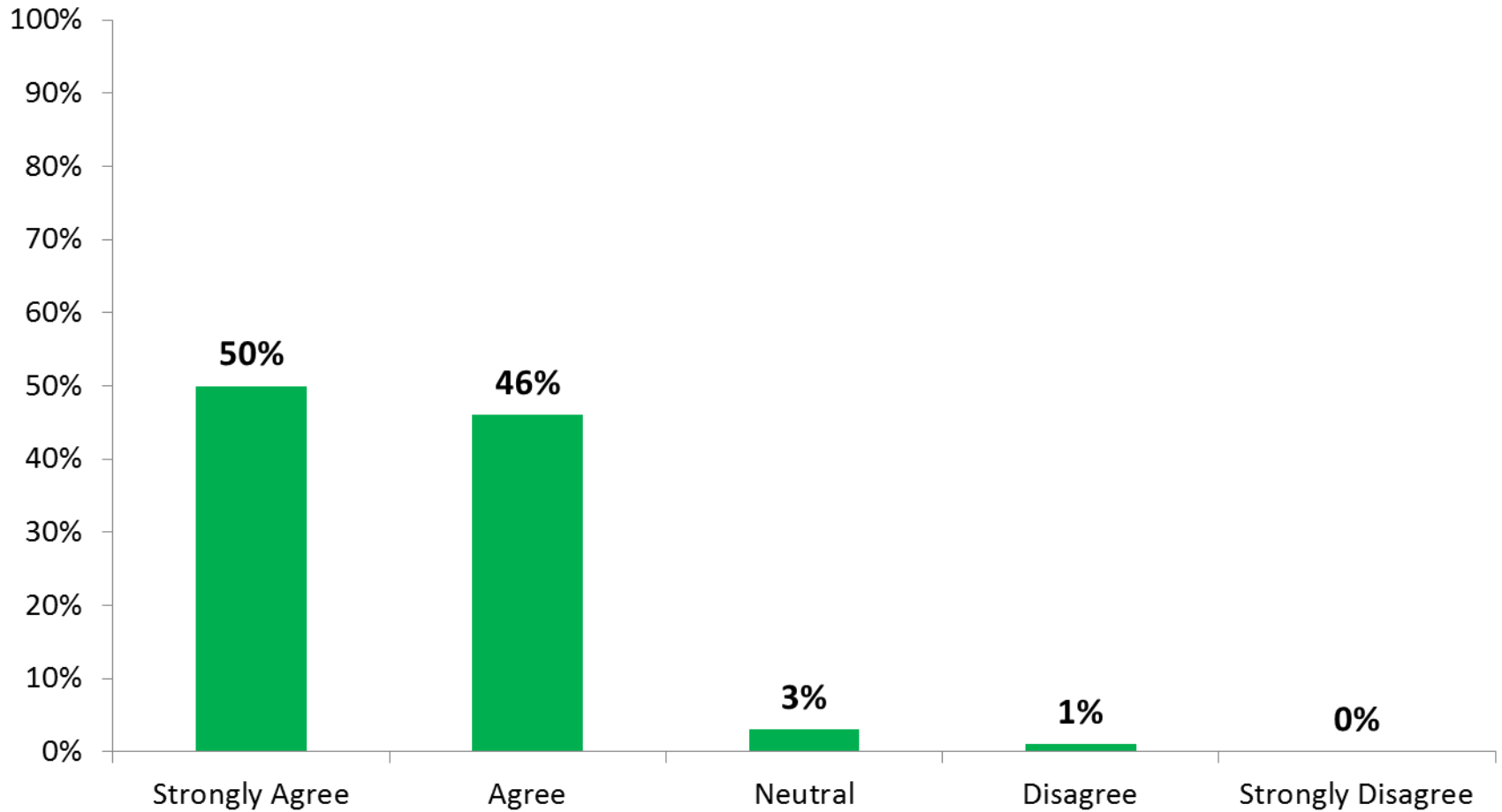
KELLOGG PARENT OPEN HOUSE SURVEY RESULTS

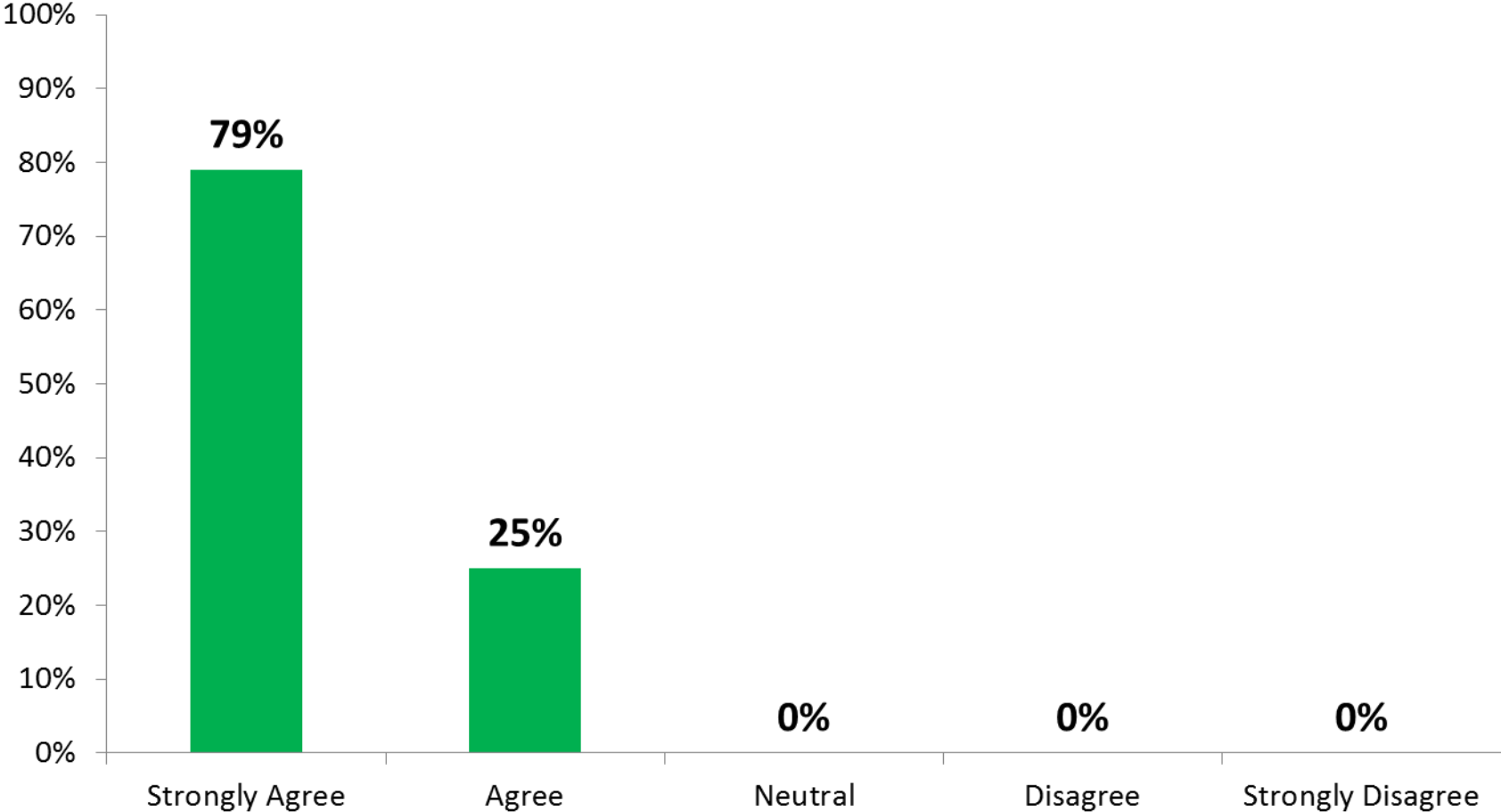
Q1: The Open House helped me better understand my child's experience at Kellogg



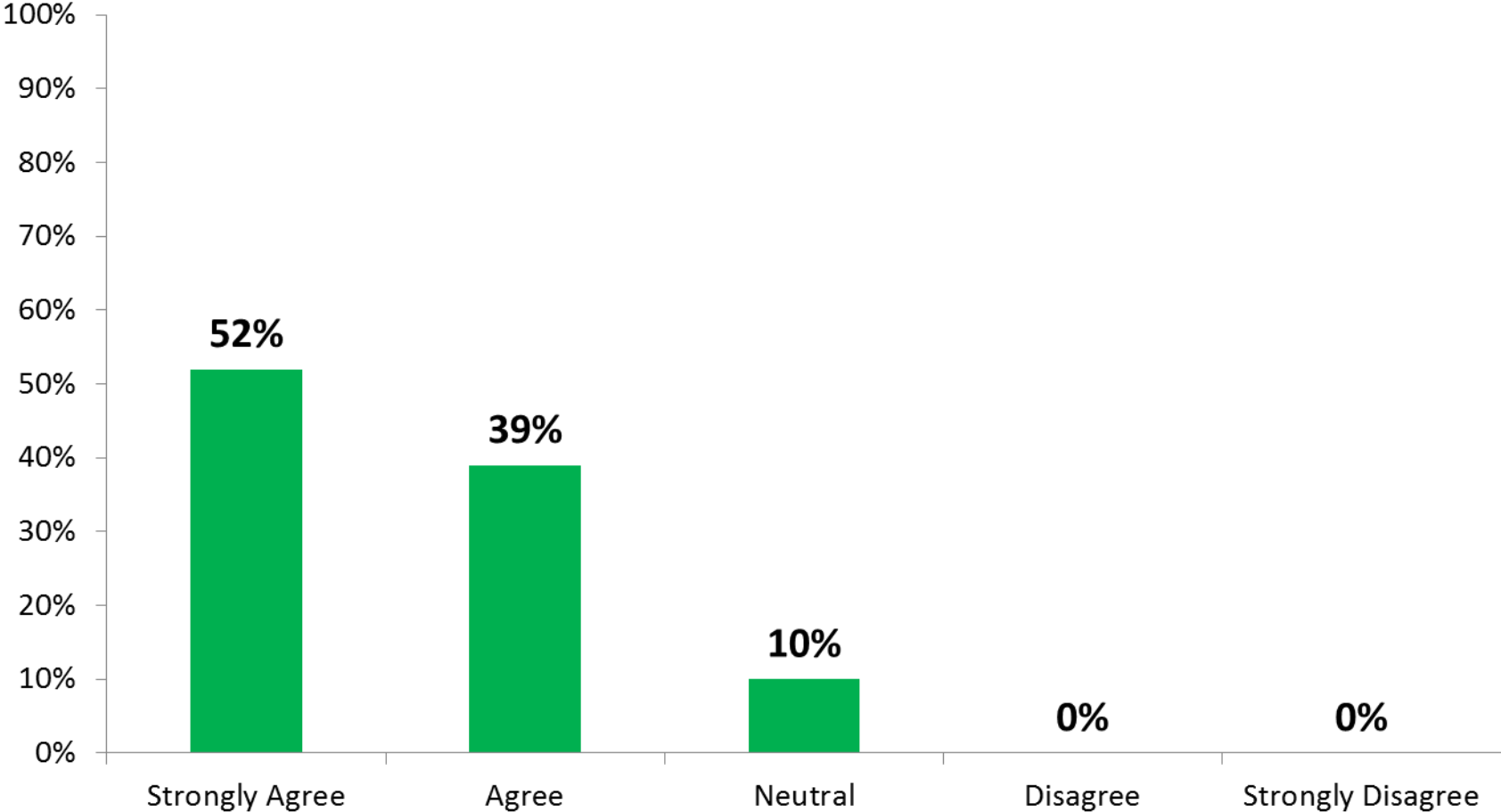
Q2: I felt the length of the Open House was appropriate
