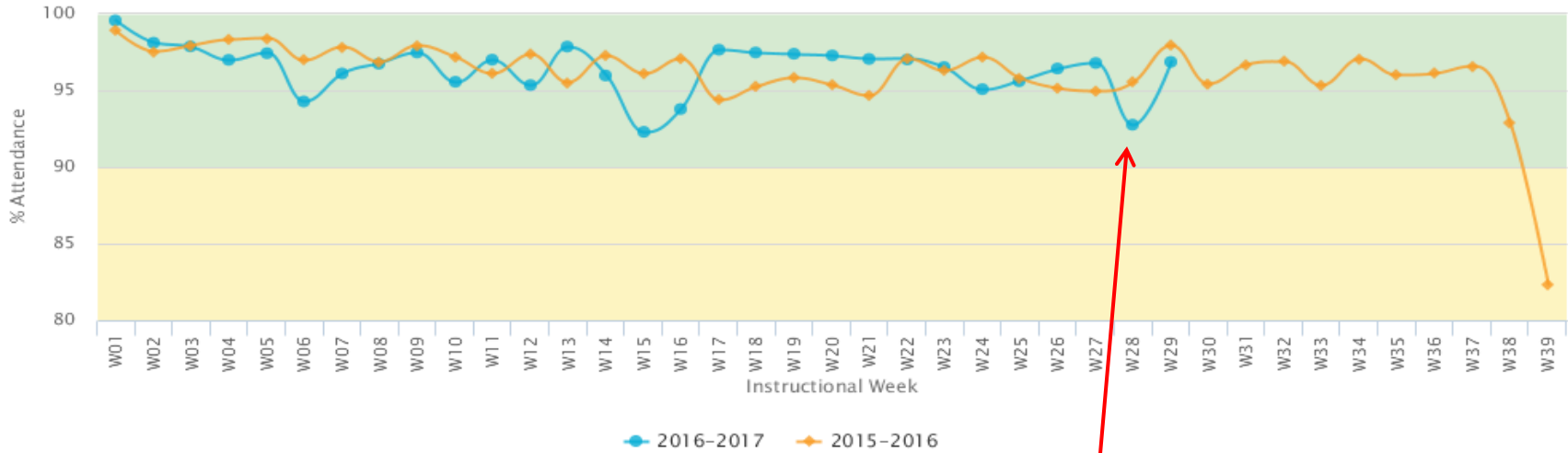
# Student Attendance

- Calculated and analyzed every 5 weeks.
- Grades 3-8 | No D/F in Reading and Math | 95% ↑ attendance.
- Kellogg Week 25 On-Track was 64.2% (2<sup>nd</sup> highest in Network 10 behind Hearst) and almost 10% higher than last year.
- Teams analyze student data and create action plans to assist students.
- Advisory and “Power Hour” came out of these meetings.

- Ms. Faccini was hired full time to provide Tier III MTSS interventions to students for the remainder of the school year.

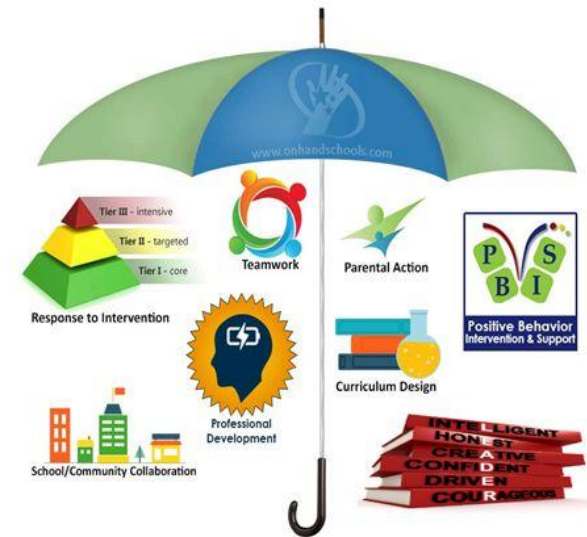
# Kellogg MTSS Team
