Community

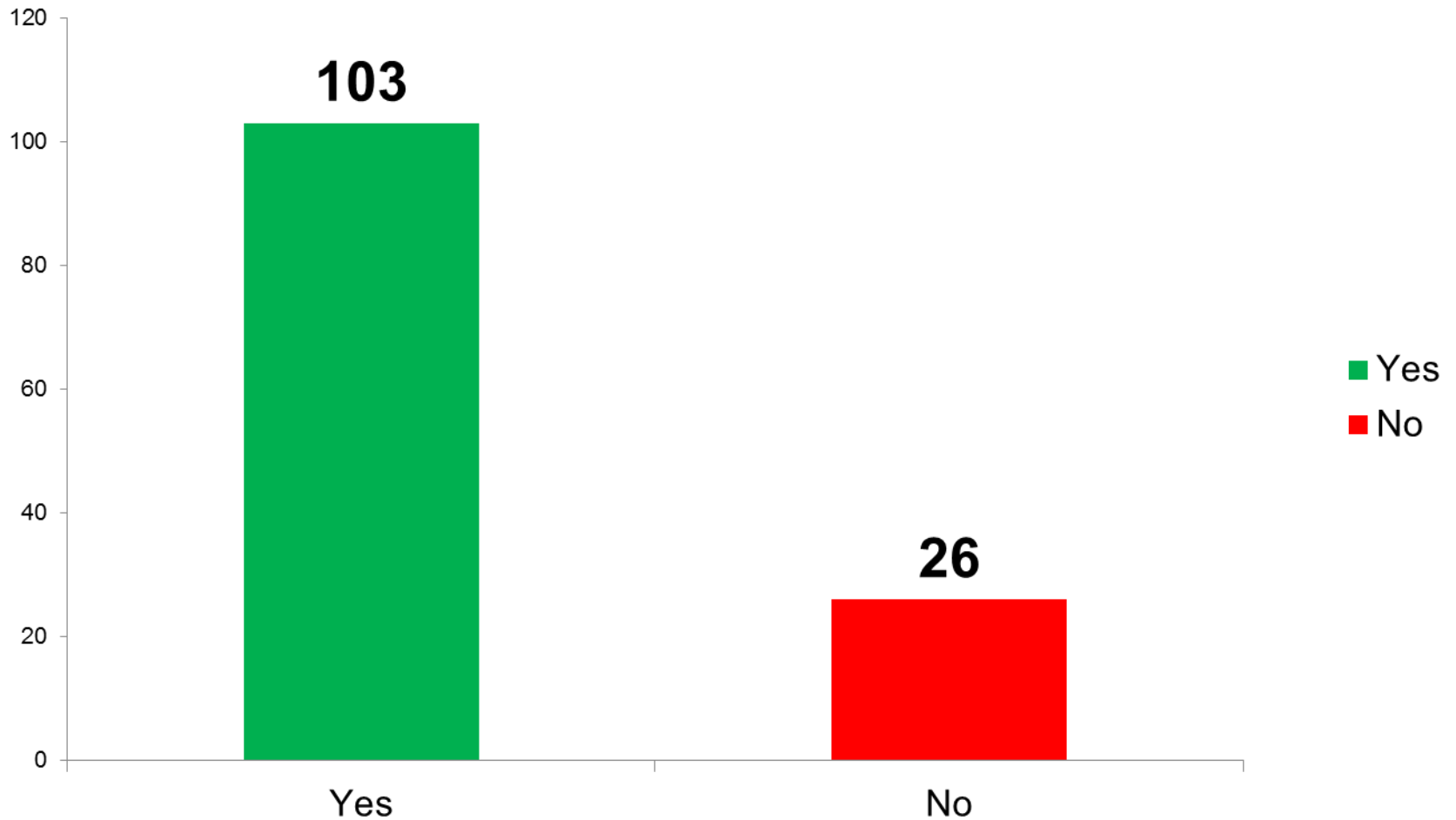
- Public Relations Committee met Thursday, April 27.

- All homeroom teachers gave families a flier notifying them the Uniform Survey and the 5 Essentials Survey when distributing report cards.

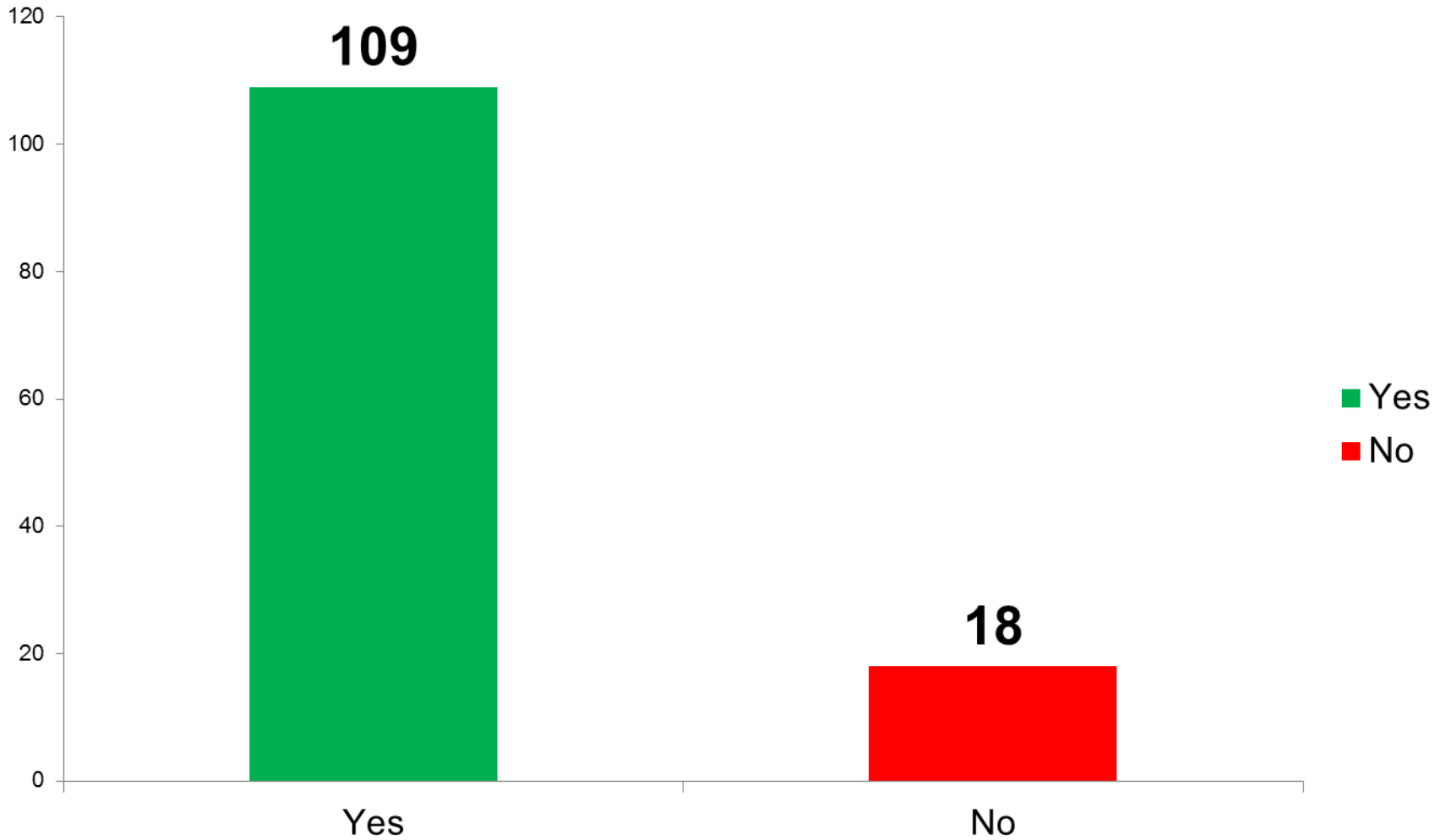
“Should Kellogg have a uniform dress code?”
