Our Vision

Our Mission

School Hours

Breakfast is available in the gym from 7:25-7:40am daily. Line up supervision is provided outside starting at 7:25am. Students will be marked tardy if they do not enter with their classroom at 7:45am. Students are not allowed to arrive to the school grounds prior to 7:25am. Dismissal is at 2:45pm. Students in need of after school care should inquire about the tuition based J at School Program.

Attendance

Each child must learn the importance of regular and punctual attendance from their parents. Doctor and dental appointments should be made after regular school hours or on Saturday, except in an emergency. There must be a valid reason to keep a child home. Please be sure to call the office between 7:15am-7:45am if your child will be absent. A note explaining a child's absence is required upon their return to school. Absences are unexcused until a note with a valid reason for absence is received.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are not allowed at Kellogg School. If seen, the cell phone will be confiscated and the parent will be required to pick it up from the office. Disciplinary action will be taken for phones on or used at school.

Graduation Requirements

All eighth grade students will receive a contract at the beginning of the school year that specifies the minimum requirements to graduate from the Chicago Public Schools along with the requirements to be invited to participate in the Kellogg Graduation Ceremony.



Honor Awards

Student will be recognized by their classroom teacher each quarter for honor awards. The school will recognize students who have achieved honors for all 4 quarters in each of the categories at an end of the school year.

Principal's Honor Roll: A child will be recognized for the Principal's Honor Roll if they have all A's in every class (all 8 IB MYP subjects) without any checks.

Honor Roll: A child will be recognized for the B Honor Roll if they have all A's & B's in all classes (all 8 IB MYP subjects).

Citizenship: Exemplary behavior and treatment of others and no behavior checks on their report card.

Perfect Attendance: A student is present every school day without any tardies or early dismissals.

Parent Portal ~ Gradebook

The Parent Portal on Gradebook will allow parents to view assignments and grades throughout the school year. The school will send information on how parents can assess this important information at the beginning of the school year.

Sports/Extra-Curricular Programs

Students must have a C or better in all subject areas along with appropriate school behavior to participate in any sports or extra-curricular programs. Students whose grade(s) fall below a C or exhibit inappropriate school behavior will be suspended from the team until administration determines appropriate grade or behavior expectations have been met. All school fees and sports fees must be paid prior to participation. Fees will not be refunded due to academic/behavior ineligibility.

Valuables

Students are not to bring valuable items such as expensive shoes, clothing, accessories, large sums of money, etc to school. Students are not allowed to bring electronic devices such as handheld games, cameras, iPods, iTouch, cell phones, etc to school. We are not responsible for the loss and/or destruction of the items and we do not investigate hearsay reports of theft.

Visitors

For the safety and security of our students, ALL visitors are required to report to the office upon arrival to sign in and receive a visitor pass. Upon departure, visitors are asked to notify the office.
